but anybody can have that kind of "joy"




But that's not true for most Christians.

Has become a burden, added items on the list of what we must do.

Light, easy burden Jesus promised us just doesn't seem true.

Sucked into the same escapes or tempted to indulge in the same pleasures



***Why am I not as joyful  
as I think I should be?***

***Do you ever feel guilty about not having enough joy as a Christian?***

We know something's missing, something's wrong, but we don't know how to fix it.

Most of us think it should "just happen"

part of what Jesus promised

part of the fruit of the Spirit

When it doesn't we start believing deep down one of two things...

"I'm not a good enough Christian to be joyful" (I am inadequate for joy)

God isn't coming through on what he promised (God is inadequate for joy)

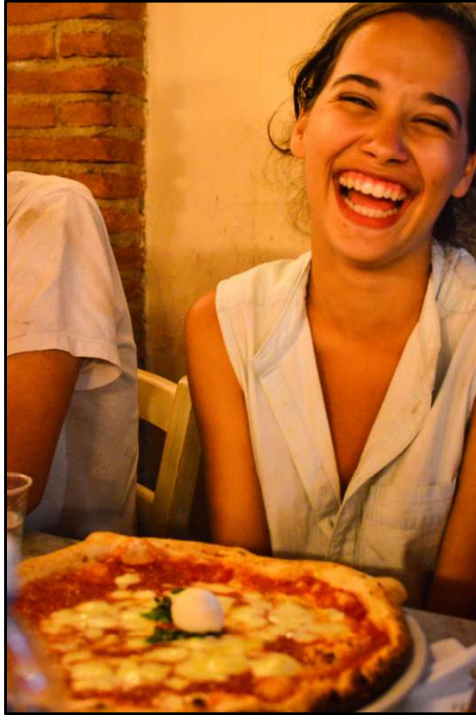


But I want us to consider a couple of “what ifs.” What if...

obtaining joy required focused attention on taking hold of it?

it is the duty of every believer to consider what biblical joy is, how to obtain it, and how to discipline your life for joy?

The choice to take hold of the joy God has promised → discipline of celebration

Celebration reflects God-ordained **balance**:

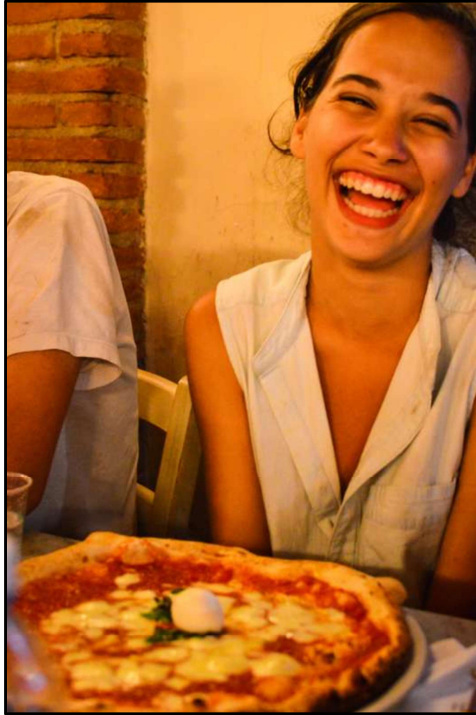
Ecclesiastes 3:4—“a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance”

Can't muster joy out of nothing... can choose to celebrate...

Our choice to pursue joy... because God promises it... because he commands that we rejoice

Philippians 4:4-5: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near."

How could God *command* joy? Isn't joy a feeling? Can God command us how to feel?

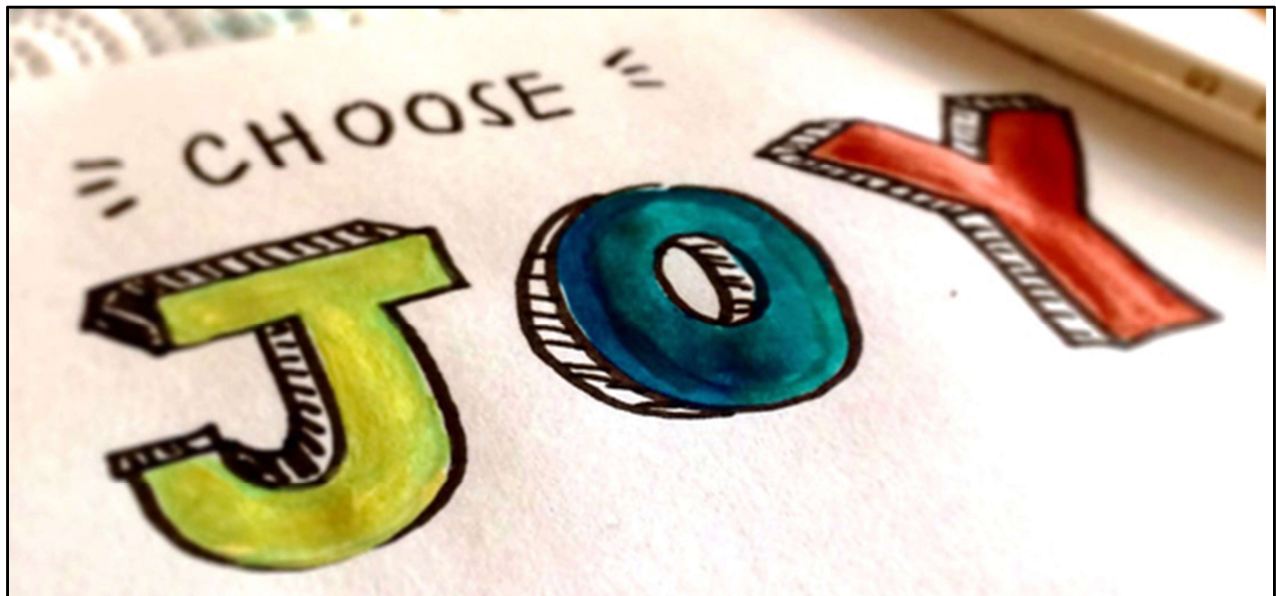
The first step understanding this concept is to understanding that joy is both a gift and a command.

Gift

can't muster it up and you can't fake it  
it's "greater" joy than worldly pleasure, which is based on circumstances, diversions, and substances.

world's joy: emotional outburst that springs out of general happiness; happiness based on things going your way.

Joy in the bible is deeper than happiness.



*Not based on circumstances, but it is tied to obedience*

Starts with everyday obedience

Can only expect seasons of fragile happiness outside of God's will



To remain close to Jesus and to experience the joy that he gives, we have to obey. Obedience is the only way to walking closer to God, and close communion with God is a source of joy.



“you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand.”

*Not based on circumstances, but it is tied to obedience*

Psalm 16:11: “you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand.”

So we’re back to where we started ...

Are we “not obeying enough”? Do we just need to buckle down and obey better and that will solve everything?

Well, you could do your best to obey God in all aspects, expecting joy to come along with the obedience, but you run the risk of reducing our devotion to God to dutiful drudgery that leaves you depressed and joyless and – worst of all – doesn’t please God.

***Do you think joyless obedience pleases God?***

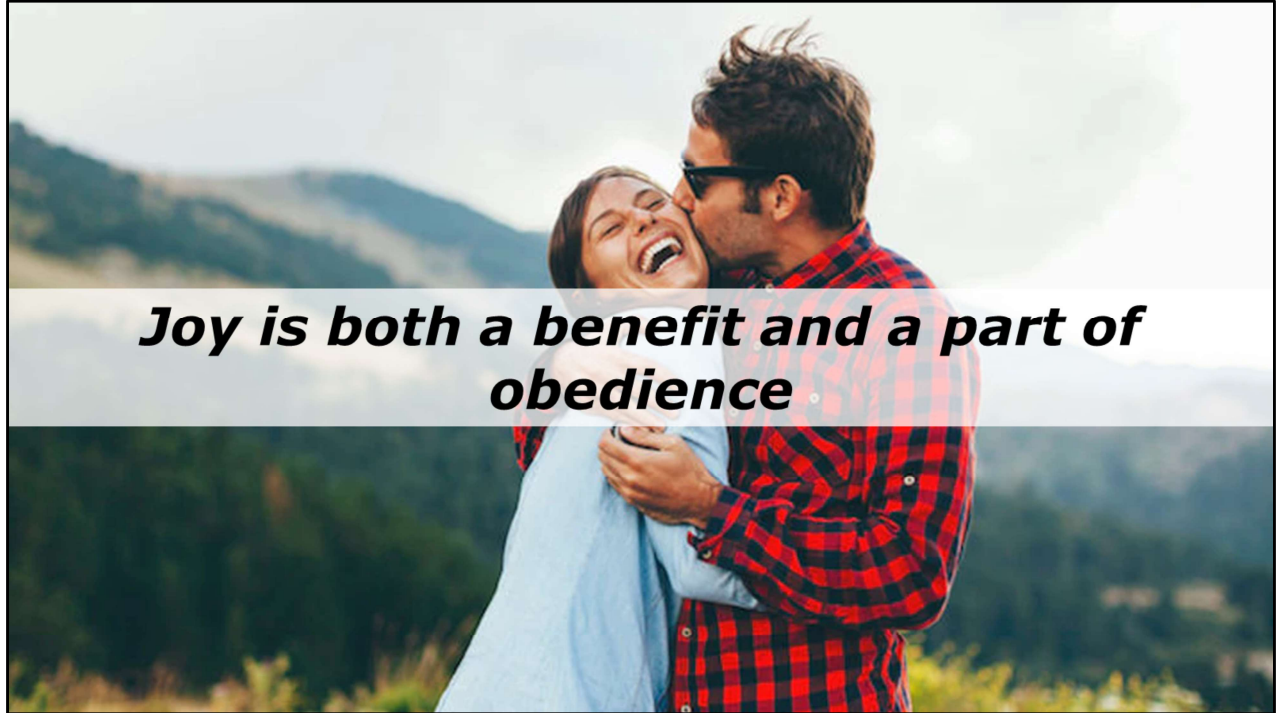


Valentine's illustration

ads: "stay out of trouble"

If that motivation comes through when you give it to her, your actions are worthless

relationships: you can do everything "right," but if you're just "putting in your time" – if there's not joy, no delight in the experience – then all of it hollow and a waste of time, because genuine love requires delight.



The greatest commandment: love God, love people. And obedience to God's number one command – the command for love – requires delight.

exchanging obedience for joy (or anything else) isn't love, it's manipulation.

love seeks to please the other because it delights in the opportunity to express its affection.

God doesn't delight in our obedience when we do it because we must; it is when those things are our delight!

So joy is both a benefit and a part of obedience.

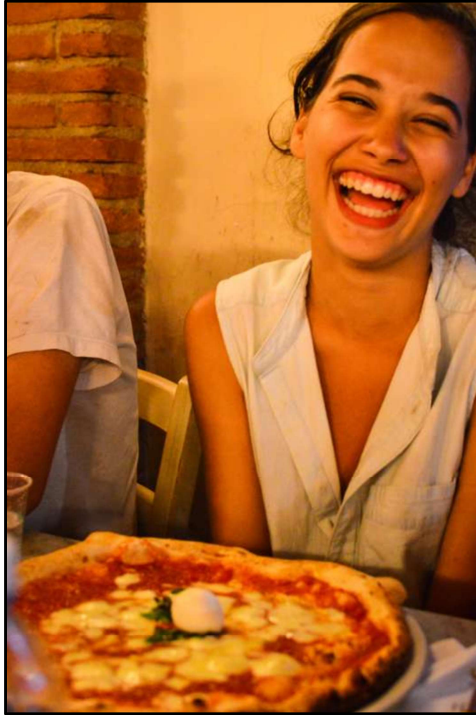

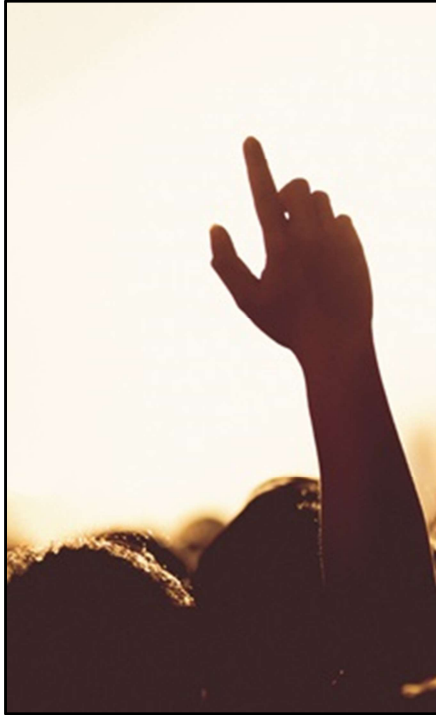
## ***Goal of Celebration***

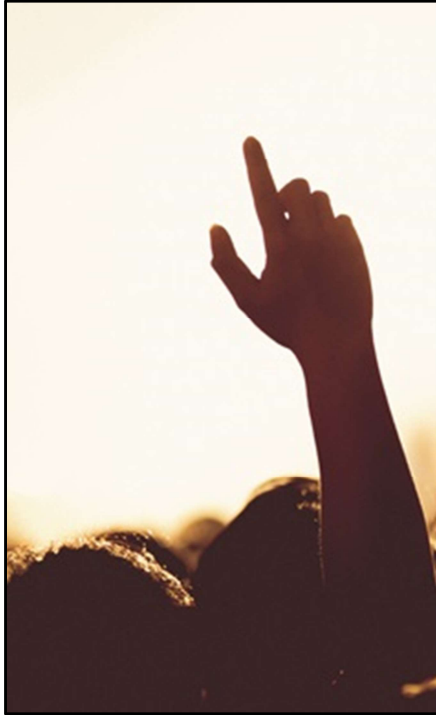

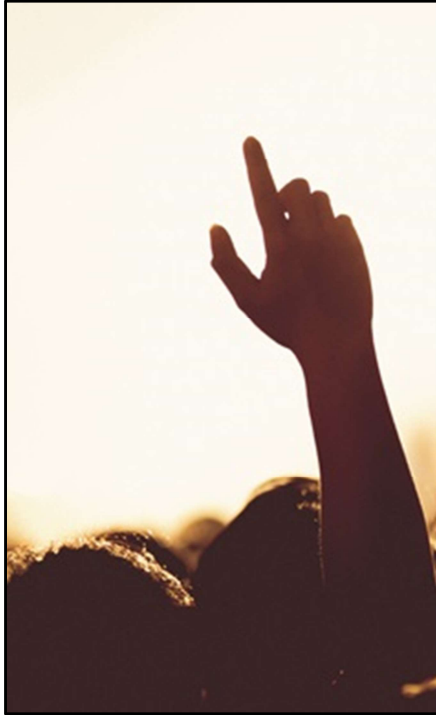

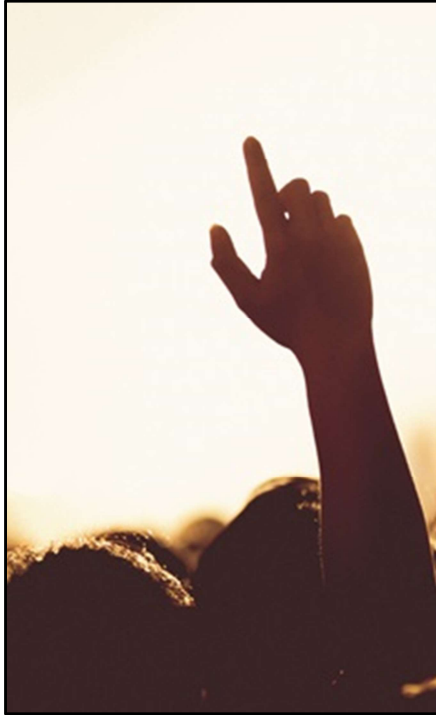

## ***Celebrating God: what he will do***

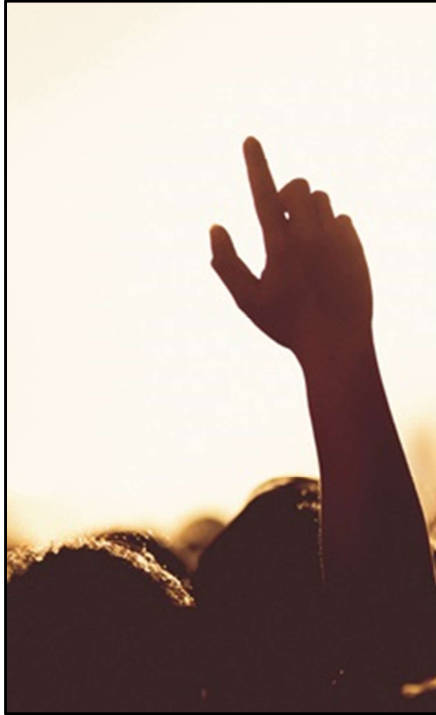

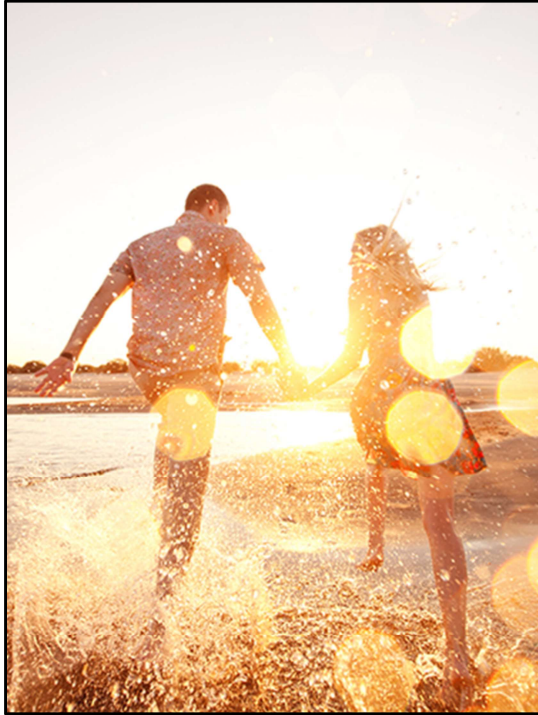


## ***What do you need to do to celebrate God more?***

What “fills your bucket”? (Important to know)



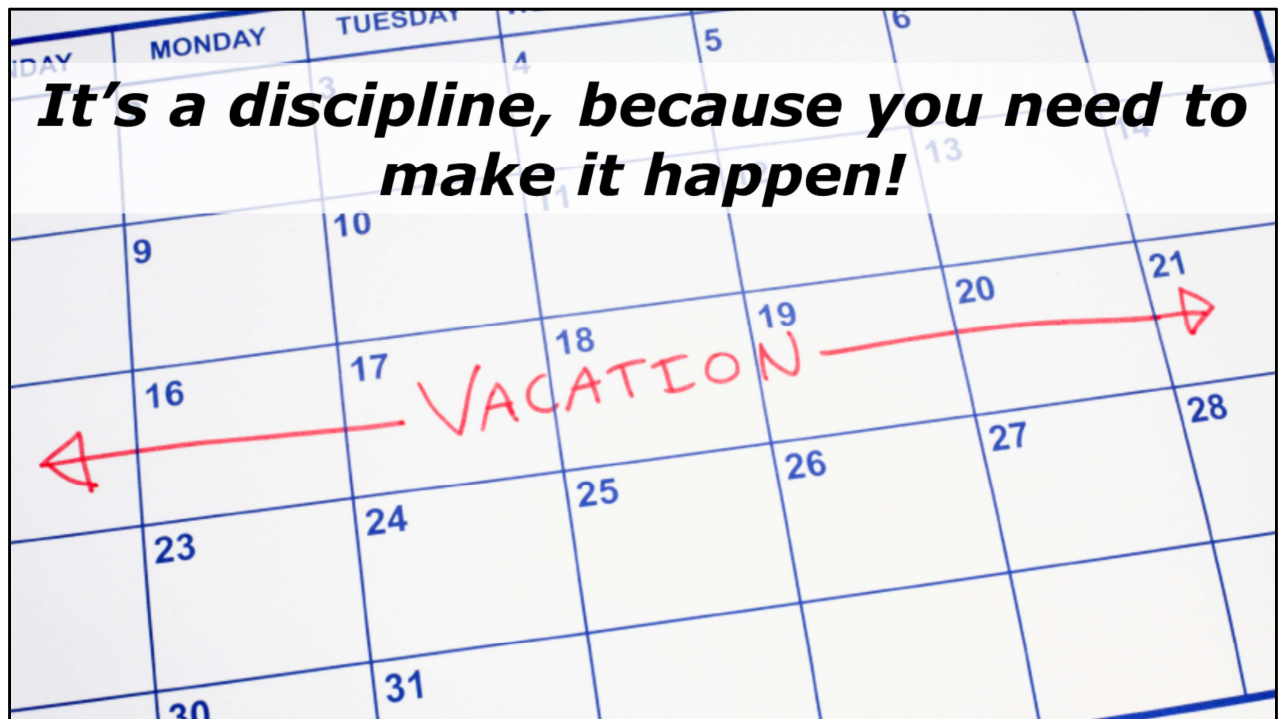
## ***Celebrate Together***
